Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 14th January 2024

What are you looking for?... Come and see.

As we hear the call of the first disciples and the call of Samuel this Sunday we might reflect on our own call to discipleship. Perhaps the first thing to notice is that becoming a disciple does not begin with our own initiative. Despite Andrew's bold proclamation that "we have found the Messiah", their following begins at God's initiative. Yes, they have to respond and be active in their following, but it comes from the gracious and free act of God in choosing them. We might call this the mystery of being chosen.

A second thing to notice is that Jesus starts by engaging with their need. He doesn't say (yet), I have come that you may have life and have it abundantly, instead he asks them what they are looking for. (The Jerusalem Bible translates it as "What do you want", but the underlying text alerts us to something more active, not simply wanting but part of an active response.) In the rite of baptism, echoing this first meeting with Jesus, candidates or their parents are asked what they ask of God's church. Many struggle to find how to put it, and we see this in these disciples too. Granted an opportunity to say something profound the best they can do is ask "where are you staying". Fr Tony Ford, who taught us some basic pastoral skills at the seminary used to say, "feelings are the royal road to needs". At the start of 2024, and with the exciting prospect of the intense discipleship of Lent rapidly approaching, we might listen to that question of Jesus, "What are you looking for?"

A third thing to notice is the invitation to "Come and see" where Jesus is staying. Later on in St John's Gospel the disciples will be invited to "abide" or "remain" in Jesus. Perhaps the best way of understanding this, and of understanding the basic work of discipleship, is as hanging out with Jesus, simply spending a lot of time with him. I often see in married couples how, after 50 years or more together they have become inseparable. After a lifetime with Jesus we become inseparable from him.

Lastly, notice how the disciples have a long way to go. We, the readers, have just heard Jesus proclaimed as the Word who was with God in the beginning. The disciples miss this and see just a messiah, good news certainly, but way short of who Jesus really is. They will only see and understand the full glory of Jesus after his resurrection, when they see and believe. Let's not be discouraged then by only having a very sketchy understanding. Rather let's use it as a spur to spend time with the Lord this year and enter more deeply into the mystery of his life.

The Word Who is Life: The Call to Mission

The updated Pastoral Plan was published last week and is available online and at the back of church. It stresses the need to keep our minds fixed on Christ, whom we encounter in the Eucharist, which forms us in his likeness. It reaffirms the significance of prayer and formation underpinning the great work of mission.

New to the plan is that those parishes (including Godalming) which make up Guildford deanery will become a single parish, cooperating much more closely, to serve the sacramental and formation needs of the communities in a flexible way and freed to bring their gifts to the service of the church in mission. How this will look in practice will need to be shaped in prayerful discernment through the coming year. The plan can be read and/or downloaded at:
