Dear brothers and sisters,

In recent days, the news from Gaza and Israel has brought great sadness. This renewed flashpoint of conflict, along with the continuing battles in Ukraine and unrest in other parts of the world, is a reminder to us of the fragility of peace across the globe. The impact on families, especially the young, is devastating beyond words and at such times as these we might wonder what the future will bring.

I know that we are all keeping these situations in our minds and in our prayers, and I ask you today to redouble prayers for peace. In this month of October – the month of the Holy Rosary – it would be wonderful if we could all offer the rosary each day for the intentions of peace in the world. I know from personal experience the appreciation of the Christian community in the Holy Land who find comfort in knowing they are remembered in prayer. Our prayers have their effect in ways we do not see and in places to which we have never travelled.

The humanitarian crisis that is so often the result of conflict has lasting effects, so our prayers must not falter. Should the time come when practical aid is needed, let us respond with generous hearts. The welcome offered to the refugee – wherever this may be required – is important beyond words, especially when loved ones have been lost. Let us pray that this welcome will always be offered, and that we shall extend this welcome when our brothers and sisters in need come to our own shores.

O God of peace, who are peace itself and whom a spirit of discord cannot grasp, nor a violent mind receive, grant that those who are one in heart may persevere in what is good and that those in conflict may forget evil and so be healed. Through Christ our Lord. Amen
