Fifth Sunday of Lent 17th March 2024

Unless a grain of wheat shall fall upon the ground and die, it remains but a single grain with no life

For me, Bernadette Farrell's setting is a bit of an ear worm. Once it's running round my head I find it hard to shake off. And maybe that's not such a bad thing, since in many ways it stands for and leans into the mystery of the cross and resurrection of Jesus which becomes increasingly our focus in these last two weeks of Lent. The death and resurrection of Jesus is absolutely central to who we are as Christians. We were joined to it in the waters of Baptism. As would-be followers of Jesus we take up our crosses, allow ourselves to die in all sorts of small ways (and especially to any sin in our lives) so that we might share the joy and glory of his resurrection.

There is a famous article on rock climbing, called *Games Climbers Play*. The author places uncertainty about the outcome as central to the activity. Rock climbers and mountaineers may do something with low risk and little backup, but also with greater risk with really good backup. He is right in identifying it as part of many adventures – there has to be just a little uncertainty in our minds at least for there to be challenge and the sense of success at overcoming it. While we might sometimes let children win at games, it doesn't work if they catch us letting them win.

And so we come to Passiontide and Holy Week. I would really encourage you to immerse yourself in the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus (the Paschal or Easter Mystery) as much as you can over these two weeks, and to allow it to engage with that mystery which is your own life, and the life of our church community. In leaving behind our usual pattern of activity, in finding a bit of creative stillness, in engaging with the liturgy, with the scripture and with silence, we can - as religious people have done throughout human history - enter that time and place in which we die along with Christ and rise to new and more abundant life with him. The outcome of this adventure is always uncertain – but the invitation is there and the promise of salvation is there too.

Please take some time this weekend to make a plan for the Great Week (Holy Week). In the rites and liturgies that we will celebrate the Lord Jesus is accomplishing his work of salvation and calls us to be with him, not just as spectators but as members of his very own body.
