

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time – 17th September 2023

On the saints "next door".

Writing on the call to holiness in today's world Pope Francis said:

'I like to contemplate the holiness present in the patience of God's people: in those parents who raise their children with immense love, in those men and women who work hard to support their families, in the sick, in elderly religious who never lose their smile. In their daily perseverance I see the holiness of the Church militant. Very often it is a holiness found in our next-door neighbours, those who, living in our midst, reflect God's presence. We might call them "the middle class of holiness".

I mention this for a few reasons. Firstly, some 30 children of our parish begin their preparation for First Reconciliation this weekend. They will be thinking about how the journey in faith begins at baptism. That journey, which we too are on, has wholeness and holiness as its aim. God calls us to be saints, not usually in some way of life that might make headlines, but in the concrete reality of our lives – patiently co-operating with his grace to grow in our capacity to respond in love and self-giving.

Secondly, this weekend has a focus on mission at home, (and is called 'Evangelii Gaudium Sunday' after Pope Francis's letter on evangelisation.) The joy of the Gospel is the fruit and a mark of this everyday holiness. It is given to those who allow themselves to experience the real depth of God's love for them (see the parable in today's Gospel). Sometimes the words of the Psalmist, "How can we sing the Lord's song in an alien land" seem to fit more than being people of joy, but the lives of the saints teach us that it can be otherwise, that we can have true joy, even when life is tough. Their experience teaches us that the source of this joy is to be found in the daily meeting with the Lord, especially in prayer and in the sacraments.

Lastly, I will be meeting next Sunday with a range of people from our parish and from Haslemere. One of the things we will be prayerfully discerning is the everyday holiness that we see around us, so that we can rejoice in and consider how we might use the gifts and strengths that God has given our church communities to help us all grow as a community of saints. Please pray for the fruitfulness of our gathering.
