

Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time – 19th November 2023

Death, Judgement, Heaven and Hell.

"Leaving it to the last minute, again?" said one lecturer to another by the photocopier one morning. "Yes" was the reply, "if it wasn't for the last minute we would never get anything done."

In the last weeks of the year the focus of the church turns towards the last things. Each week in the Creed we profess that "he will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead", yet these days we rarely talk about judgement – that each of us will be held to account for our stewardship of the life entrusted to us. In response to movements and cultural tendencies that have suggested that we should be afraid of the reality of sin in our lives and the possibility of hell, the church has rightly sought to proclaim the abundance of the love and mercy of God. Fear can paralyse us and cause us to do things that are ultimately not the best for us. Whether on the lips of Gabriel or of Jesus himself the repeated refrain of the Gospel is "Do not be afraid".

Lack of fear, however, does not mean a lack of concern or caution. When climbing or heading off into the mountains being aware of the risks and knowing that you are well-prepared and they are well managed allows you then to enjoy the day. Not managing the risks is the wide path to misery and hurt.

Our contemplation of the last things – death, judgement, heaven and hell – are offered not to scare us (for we should have confidence in the love and mercy of God, "*C'est la confiance*" declared St Therese), but to add some urgency to our conversion (our turning to God) and our search for greater holiness.

On the one hand, at the end of our lives we will be judged: "either entrance into the blessedness of heaven – through a purification or immediately, – or immediate and everlasting damnation". If we do not freely choose to love God and reflect that in our active love of him, our neighbour and ourselves (i.e. if we commit serious sin) then he will not compel us to his eternal presence. On the other hand, if we repent of our sin and accept God's merciful love, he can make us ready for him. If does not require much of us – just a grain, a small bit of desire for God to work with, but it does need something.

For those who are early in the steps of faith, the milk and honey of the unbounded love and mercy of God needs to be the focus of the Gospel. We grow in love of God by attraction not by threat. But for those of us who are advancing in the ways of faith an awareness of the reality of judgement may often be the grain of sand that forms the pearl.
