Second Sunday of Lent - 25th February 2024

It is wonderful for us to be here

The second Sunday of Lent always presents us with the Gospel of the Transfiguration. Jesus goes up the mountain with his closest disciples who experience a glimpse of Jesus in his glory and hear the reassuring words of the Father – "This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him". In this way they learn that "the Passion leads to the glory of the Resurrection" and are strengthened for what is to come.

In the first reading we hear of the Binding of Isaac (which we will hear again on Easter night, with a focus on Abraham and Isaac as foreshadowing the saving love of God, the Father and the Son) and see how the deep faith of Abraham helped him in an impossible situation (offer my son or disobey God). His faithful following results in him being showered with blessings. The cross leads to glory.

As we enter the second week of Lent our initial enthusiasm can begin to fade (are we nearly there yet?) and we need encouragement in those things we are undertaking to support our turning more to God and growing in holiness. These stories are offered to us so that we too might learn that the struggle is a not a sign of things going wrong but is an essential step on the way to our sharing in the glory and joy of Christ.

Pope Francis, in his letter opening a new chapter in Evangelisation, *The Joy of the Gospel (Evangelii Gaudium)*, places at its centre the invitation to know and experience in our day, our own struggle and our own lives what Peter, James and John experienced on the mountain of Tabor.

I invite all Christians, everywhere, at this very moment, to a renewed personal encounter with **Jesus Christ**, or at least an openness to letting him encounter them; I ask all of you to do this unfailingly each day. No one should think that this invitation is not meant for him or her, since "no one is excluded from the joy brought by the Lord".

The Aparecida document gives us a guide as to where to seek out this encounter. It says that, due to the invisible action of the Holy Spirit, the encounter with Christ takes place in faith received and lived in the **Church**. The **Eucharist** (especially on Sundays) is the privileged place of the disciple's encounter with Jesus Christ, but it is not the only place he comes to us. We encounter Him in **Sacred Scripture** read in the church, and in particular in *Lectio Divina*; in the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**; in the **Sacred Liturgy**; in personal and community **prayer**; in the **poor**, the afflicted, and the sick; in the midst of a **living community** in faith and fraternal love.

May we seek him out each day and be able to declare "It is good for us to be here": the joy it brings, even if the midst of adversity, strengthens us and our faith and is the essential root of our missionary activity.
