Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 29th October 2023

You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt

The readings this Sunday direct us to the twin commandment of love. The rest, as they say, is commentary. However, if it were really that simple, everyone would be a saint and sin would be no more. So here are two things to help us grow as men and women who live by the law of love.

Firstly, notice that when God commands Israel to take care of the stranger in their midst he reminds them that they themselves were once strangers – until he intervened and brought them out from slavery into freedom. God reminds them of why they should be good: love of him and of neighbour (and strangers are neighbours) is a very basic matter of gratitude. Our regular examination of our lives and the recognition of the blessings that we have and continue to receive provide the spiritual foundation for our response in charity. The lives of many who live with little teach us that it is the appreciation of what we have that spurs us on to charity far more than the quantity of what we have received.

Secondly, notice that love requires action in very concrete terms. God spells out what he expects his people to do. OK, he doesn't cover every situation, but the simple lessons we are given here remind us that our discipleship means that we need to be kind and more than fair in our dealings with others. Some companies may think it fine to trade on 90-day payment terms, but that is not the mark of a Christian – we should pay our bills on time and willingly. The widow and orphan, so much a focus of social justice in Torah, represent those who today do not have anyone else to speak for them or fight their corner. As a church in the twenty-first century we are called to make a particular effort to ensure that the voice of the poor is heard. And what of our response to migrants? How do we speak of them and how does their welfare feature in our political thinking? Is our discourse and thinking marked with mercy and compassion or with harshness and cold hearts?

So, now that the half-term break is over, here is a little "homework": make an "Examen" – a prayerful consideration of the blessings received and of where we have succeeded and failed in love. The sort of prayer I am talking about here is not finding a big stick to beat ourselves up with, but opening ourselves to God's presence in our lives. Synod of Bishops The members issued a *Letter* to the People of God as they concluded last week. They write: "We want to thank God with all of you for the beautiful and enriching experience we have lived... For the first time, at Pope Francis' invitation, men and women have been invited, in virtue of their baptism, to sit at the same table to take part, not only in the discussions, but also in the voting process of this Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. Together, in the complementarity of our vocations, our charisms and our ministries, we have listened intensely to the Word of God and the experience of others... To progress in its discernment, the Church absolutely needs to listen to everyone, starting with the poorest. This requires a path of conversion on its part, which is also a path of praise: 'I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that you have hidden these things from the wise and understanding and revealed them to little children'..."
