Third Sunday of Lent - 3rd March 2024

He fed them with manna in the desert

One of the lenses through which we see and experience the season of Lent is the experience of Israel on its journey from Egypt to the promised land and of the covenant that God renews and makes with them in the course of their journey. And so last week the story of the manna in the desert (Exodus 16) was offered as part of the scriptures for daily prayer. It seemed to speak quite powerfully to our present situation, in which we may be worried about the future and changes in where and when we gather for Mass and how we relate to the other parishes around us. Perhaps we can take courage that in salvation history others have been through periods of change and grown in holiness and grace. There are four aspects of the story that I would offer for reflection.

The first is that Israel starts to complain. They are missing the familiarity of the 'pots of meat' that they enjoyed in Egypt. They have forgotten the deeds of the Lord. But their reaction is very human. Very few of us like a lot of change. But as St John Henry Newman said "**To live is to change**, and to be perfect is to have changed often."

The second is that **the Lord hears the cry of his people**. He doesn't punish them for this wobble. Instead, he recognises their distress and gives them bread from heaven to eat. We know and understand that the bread that he gives us is the Eucharist, nothing less than his own body and blood. It is his response to our distress in the uncertainty of the journey. (For some reason we forget the supply of quails – I wonder if there might be scope for the eating of small roast birds with honey wafer biscuits as part of our liturgical year....).

The third is that Moses and Aaron are commanded to keep a portion of the manna and to have it on display so that Israel might remember that the Lord fed them in the. This action, I think, foreshadows our practice of **Eucharistic Adoration**, in which we extend the remembering of the deeds of the Lord. The short responsory at Benediction takes us back to Exodus as we sing "You have given them bread from heaven. Containing in itself all sweetness." (*Panem de caelo praestitisti eis. Omne delectamentum in se habentem*, for those who know it better in Latin.)

Lastly, **Israel ate manna for forty years**. This was no feeding of 5,000 on one evening. The journey from Egypt to the promised land was not a short one. Israel continued to be a people on the move, foreshadowing the pilgrim people of God that we are. Throughout this journey the Lord gave them each day all that they needed. **And he will give us all that we need for our journey**.

HOLY HOLY: Sanctus, Sanctus Dominus Deus Sabaoth. Pleni sunt cæli et terra gloria tua. Hosanna in excelsis. Benedictus qui venit in nomine Domini. Hosanna in excelsis. (see p16 in Parish Mass books)

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: The sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for her young: by your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God. Blessed are they who dwell in your house, for ever singing your praise.
