O God you are my God for you I long, for you my soul is thirsting.

Being Christian is ultimately a love affair. The God who loves us into being invites us to love him in return, and that love spills over into love for all his creatures. The prophet Jeremiah has discovered this. Even though his prophecy makes him a laughing-stock he knows that he has been "seduced" – he has experienced a fire in his heart that cannot be contained.

The Responsorial Psalm today is sung at Morning Prayer for every feast of the church's year. It expresses a deep longing for God, an existential cry from the heart – *my body pines for you, like a dry weary land without water.* This longing leads the soul to *gaze on you [God] in the sanctuary*, and to sing of a love which *is better than life*.

The epistle invites us to allow this deep love to shape us – to be *modelled by your new mind*. As we are re-formed by this love of God we come to share in it more deeply.

In the Gospel passage, Jesus cautions his disciples about an idealised vision of his mission and their following. Love is not all easy going (as Jeremiah well knew). It requires a genuine self-sacrifice, and a letting go in love, that leads to a sweetness and light beyond our hopes and expectations.

Bishop Richard often reminds us of the centrality of prayer in the Christian life. As the summer draws to a close and our schedules fill up once again perhaps we might make fresh purpose and intention about the place of prayer in our lives – of the existential necessity of spending time each day longing and yearning for God and a fresh experience of his love for us. It is the origin of who we are, who we are called to be, and of how we are to live in love with one another and to care for our common home.
